IN THEIR ATTEMPT TO KEEP THE PARISH INFORMED ON ALL ASPECTS OF THE BUILDING OF A RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CENTER, AND TO ADDRESS ALL QUIESTIONS AND CONCERNS, THE BUILDING COMMITTEE AND PARISH LEADERSHIP WILL USE THE BULLETIN AS A MEANS TO ANSWER QUESTIONS TO THE BEST OF THEIR ABILITY

QUESTION: Why have the building committee and architect considered a wood frame, brick veneer structure versus a Metal Building?

1. The frame cost is only one consideration when looking at a building solution. Initially, steel framing may appear to be less expensive than a wood frame, but when considering the total structure, recent experience demonstrates the cost to be approximately 30% higher, when we look at the additional construction required to make the steel frame structure as efficient as conventional wood framing.

2. The roof skin and wall skin of a metal building are rated at a 35 year life span. The rated life span of brick veneer is 86 years...

3. When considering the choice between wood framing and steel framing, one must consider all the other aspects of what has to be completed to have a total and complete structure. The shell cost is only a fraction of the total cost of a structure...One must also consider the following: Additional framing required for a metal building to receive interior finishes and insulation, type of exterior wall insulation, and R-value. Roofing, windows, exterior doors, cabinetry, equipment, wall finishes, floor finishes, doors, and ceilings...Also, the Electrical, Mechanical, and Plumbing required to complete a structure...

SUMMARY: We have explored the construction methods and types on this project, and have come to the conclusion that the wood frame, brick veneer structure will give us much more long term efficiency, and cost efficiency, than a metal building, with reduced initial construction costs....The costs estimated for this structure are all very consistent with similar construction projects of this type and scope...One must remember, that we are not building a machinery shed, or pole barn, we are constructing a functional, efficient, durable facility for the Parish to utilize, for years to come...

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. The US bishops' pastoral on stewardship reminds us that Baptism gives all of His disciples a share in His priestly work and calls them "to offer up the world and all that is in it – especially themselves – to the Lord of all."
